アクティビティー
Ask about animals that they already know: everyday, jungle, Africa. Have kids imitate sounds then compare to one another. Ask if they know what animals are common in Japan.
Have kids listen to animal sounds, see pictures and romanji and guess from gestures from teachers through games and interactive lecture.
Flyswatter game to see if the can match animal pics to Japanese names. Teachers facilitate the game as they call out each animal and help kids focus on pronuciatian as well as hints to what animal is being said.
Handouts whith animals and romanji so kids can review on their own time and practice.
Quiz handout that requires kids to write English names and the sounds the animals make from a list of romanji.
